The Third of the Caversham lectures takes place on Tuesday evening at 7.30 pm in the lounge. Blair Fitzharis, who wrote the DCC's report on the subject under discussion, gives a highly topical presentation given the recent flooding of South Dunedin on the potential vulnerability of our suburb to coastal flooding and ocean inundation as a result of global warning. The presentation will also address the high water table and porous soils issues of the

locality. Blair will also offer options as to how Dunedin might respond to this developing threat. All welcome.

New Presiding Bishop The American Episcopal church has elected Michael Curry to be its 27th Presiding Bishop in succession to Katharine Jefferts Schori. Curry is an Afro-American and former Bishop of North Carolina, with a passion for evangelism and a highly rhetorical preaching style. His father was also a priest of an Anglo-Catholic ilk. He now presides over a church of 109 dioceses in 16 different nations. If Nigerian Bishops hope to find in him a soul brother they will be disappointed for like his predecessor he is a champion of marriage equality.

December highlights On Sunday 20 December St Peters will have its Nine Lessons and Carols Service but with this difference – it will be in the morning at 10.30 am. In the past having this Service at the traditional evening time slot meant that the main morning Service and this traditional Christmas Service competed with one another for numbers to their mutual detriment. So following a growing trend in South Island parishes Nine Lessons and Carols moves to the morning time when far more people are likely to attend, but with this difference – given the strong Eucharistic tradition of this parish the Service will conclude with a brief Eucharistic prayer and communion. Looking ahead to the end of the year we see out the old year and see in the new with a Watchnight Service consisting of a Vigil of Readings and a celebration of the Eucharist according to a westernised version of the Liturgy of St Basil. A social time will follow.

<u>La Corona</u> Preparations are under way for a special Service on the first Sunday in Advent 29 November at 5 pm, a meditative reflection on John Donne's "La Corona" sequence of poems in which Mary reflects on key events in Christ's life. An appropriate Scripture reading accompanies each poem, together with a personal reflection on the particular theme of the poem, and an accompanying piece of suitable Jacobean music. This Service is the brainchild of Ross McComish and Heather Brooks who devised and organised just such a liturgy in their Wellington days.
