In the past having this Service at the traditional evening time slot meant that the main morning Service and this traditional Christmas Service competed with one another for numbers to their mutual detriment. So following a growing trend in South Island parishes Nine Lessons and Carols moves to the morning time when far more people are likely to attend, but with this difference – given the strong Eucharistic tradition of this parish the Service will conclude with a brief Eucharistic prayer and communion. Looking ahead to the end of the year we see out the old year and see in the new with a Watchnight Service consisting of a Vigil of Readings and a celebration of the Eucharist according to a westernised version of the Liturgy of St Basil. A social time will follow.

Changes expected in Tikanga Maori The death of Bishop John Grey, who presided over Tikanga Maori in the South Island, presages several leadership changes. It is likely that Archbishop Brown Turei will now retire, thus clearing the way for the choice of a new and younger Pihopa. Kito Pikaahu, the able Bishop of the far north must be reckoned to be a serious contender for the position. Voices within South Island Maori will be insisting that this time around the Bishop of Te Waipounamu not come from a North Island tribe. Bishop Muru Walters, who presides over Tikanga Maori in the greater Wellington area is now 80 and may well step down soon.
