The developing Flag saga Parishioners may recall that two of our Anglican Communion flags were stolen from the flag pole in reasonably rapid succession. One was returned and run up the flag pole last week, with the Vicar sighting an apprehensive and sheepish looking teenager exiting the tower vicinity about an hour beforehand. Last Saturday night an attempt was made to return the second flag in a similar manner but something went wrong and the halyard became entangled on the tower power points, with the result that the flag slumped on the flagpole cradle. Swift action by a couple of 8 o'clock attendees got the flag down to safety.

Changes at Diocesan Office A restructuring of roles at the Diocesan Office has seen the abolition of the role of Diocesan Manager and the consequent departure of Graeme Sykes, with instead the Diocesan Accountant Ginny Kitchingham having her role expanded to become the Diocesan Treasurer, the Bishop's PA Debbie Flintoff now becoming the Diocesan Registrar, and Dominque Aitcheson remaining as the Accounts Clerk. The Diocesan Communications Officer position now becomes redundant due to lack of further funding, and the under 40's educator Benjamin Brock-Smith departs for St Johns for ministerial training with his position not being replaced. This new realignment is to be welcomed since Ginny, Debbie and Dominique are efficient and effective and will transact the key business of the diocese in a timely manner with a consequent follow on reduction in administration costs.

No Lord's Prayer please, we're British The Church of England's communications department thought it had come up with a catchy idea when it put together an attractive commercial with people in different work places and life situations each saying a line of the Lord's Prayer as an encouragement for the English to take time out for prayer in the lead up to Christmas. Aimed at cinema audiences, the project has run into a major snag with the major cinema chains refusing to place the advertisement on the grounds that it might offend some people. Even militant atheist Richard Dawkins has opposed the ban, the Prime Minister has declared it to be ridiculous and the equality and human rights commission has said that no-one has the right to be cocooned against all possible offence. A leading ad man has however said that all religious groups should be banned from advertising.
