and the Baptism of the Lord as part of an integrated and extended cycle of Scriptural and Eucharistic reflection on the entire mystery of the Incarnation, and its saving implications for us.

Documentary film season planned As the Vicar plans the parish year ahead a season of documentary films is definitely intended. These will include Best of Enemies about the 1968 series of television debates between Gore Vidal and William Buckley Junior at the time of the 1968 Republican and Democratic political conventions, Red Army about the Red Army Ice Hockey Team, world champions whose fortunes mirrored the rapid social and cultural changes in Russia, The Salt of the Earth about Sebastiao Salgado one of the world's great social photographers who photographed some of the major humanitarian disasters of the late 20th century, From Scotland with Love a skilfully blended collage of documentary footage with no voice over or commentary just a brilliant sound track from one of Scotland's leading folk singers, and excerpts from The World's Great Churches. These will include the painted churches of Romania and the Cathedral of Monreale in Sicily. The film season has yet to be timetabled.

Two bound for Canterbury summit Two Archbishops from this church will attend the Primates' meeting in Canterbury from 11-16 January. Archbishops Philip Richardson and Winston Halapua will be among 37 Primates at the historic meeting called by the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby. The primates will discuss key issues facing the church, including a review of Communion structures leading up to the next Lambeth Conference. The agenda will also pick up issues of religiously motivated violence, the protection of children and vulnerable adults, the environment and human sexuality. In calling the conference, Archbishop Justin Welby said: "I have suggested to all primates that we need to consider recent developments but also look afresh at our ways of working as a Communion and especially as primates, paying proper attention to developments in the past. Our way forward must respect the decisions of Lambeth 1998, and of the various Anglican Consultative Council and Primates' meetings since then. It must also be a way forward, guided by the absolute imperative for the church to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ, to make disciples and to worship and live in holiness, and recognising that the way in which proclamation happens and the pressures on us vary greatly between Provinces. We each live in a different context. The difference between our societies and cultures, as well as the speed of cultural change in much of the global north, tempts us to divide as Christians: when the command of scripture, the prayer of Jesus, the tradition of the church and our theological understanding urges unity. The 21st century Anglican family must have space for deep disagreement, and even mutual criticism, so long as we are faithful to the revelation of Jesus Christ, together.
