It is helpful to send a copy of your submission to the local MP. Remember that all letters sent to your MP at parliament do not require a stamp.

Documentary film season in February and March The documentary film season will run over five successive

Tuesdays in February and March. The films will be shown in the Vicarage with a start time of 7.30 pm. These will include From Scotland with Love a skilfully blended collage of documentary footage with no voice over or commentary just a brilliant sound track from one of Scotland's leading folk singers - 9 February, Red Army about the Red Army Ice Hockey Team, world champions whose fortunes mirrored the rapid social and cultural changes in Russia on 16 February, The Salt of the Earth about Sebastiao Salgado one of the world's great social photographers who photographed some of the major humanitarian disasters of the late 20th century - to be screened on 23 February, Best of Enemies about the 1968 series of television debates between Gore Vidal and William Buckley Junior at the time of the 1968 Republican and Democratic political conventions on 1 March, and excerpts from The World's Great Churches on 8 March, which will include the painted churches of Romania and the Cathedral of Monreale in Sicily.
