<u>Candlemas</u> Today we celebrate the feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, which ends the season of Epiphany tide. As we prepare to process around the Church at the beginning of the 10.30 am Service we bless the candles in this manner:

Priest: May the light and peace of Jesus Christ our Lord be with you.

The Lord bless you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

He is worthy of all thanksgiving and praise.

Blessed are you, Lord our God, King of the universe! You make our darkness be light. For with you is the well of life and in your light we see light.

Blessed be God forever.

(The Priest blesses the candles, and then says)

We wait for your loving kindness, O Lord,

in the midst of your temple.

Open to us the gates of righteousness

that we may enter and give thanks to the Lord.

God is the Lord who has shown us light,

Let us offer in his dwelling an oblation with great gladness. (The procession then begins)

<u>Evensong and Benediction</u> This evening at 5 pm followed by a social gathering with refreshments in the parish lounge.

<u>Ash Wednesday</u> Lent begins on Wednesday of this week. The Eucharist and the Imposition of Ashes will be celebrated at 10 am and 7 pm that day. This is an important worship obligation for Anglican Christians.

<u>Fish and Chip Friday Eucharists</u> Continuing last year's popular custom our Lenten extra will be a Eucharist celebrated at 5.30 pm each Friday in Lent in the parish lounge with a dialogue sermon followed by a shared fish and chip tea. The first Friday celebration will be this Friday.

<u>Documentary film season in February and March</u> The documentary film season will run over five successive Tuesdays in

February and March. The films will be shown in the Vicarage with a start time of 7.30 pm. These will include From Scotland with Love a skilfully blended collage of documentary footage with no voice over or commentary just a brilliant sound track from one of Scotland's leading folk singers - 9 February, Red Army about the Red Army Ice Hockey Team, world champions whose fortunes mirrored the rapid social and cultural changes in Russia on 16 February, The Salt of the Earth about Sebastiao Salgado one of the world's great social photographers who photographed some of the major humanitarian disasters of the late 20th century - to be screened on 23 February, Best of Enemies about the 1968 series of television debates between Gore Vidal and William Buckley Junior at the time of the 1968 Republican and Democratic political conventions on 1 March, and excerpts from The World's Great Churches on 8 March, which will include the painted churches of Romania and the Cathedral of Monreale in Sicily.

Return of the Rare Byrds Dunedin's Tudor music group will hold a concert in the Church the following day on Sunday afternoon 28 February as part of Dunedin's early music festival. They first came to us last year and it will be good to welcome them back again.
