Renewal of baptismal promises The 10.30 am Sung Mass today will begin with the renewal of our baptismal promises, which the Vicar will lead from the font. The response to each of the questions is, "I do." This will be followed by a procession around the interior of the Church, which the able bodied are invited to join. Because the renewal of baptismal promises includes an assent to the essentials of the Nicene Creed we will not recite the creed in its

usual place, but will instead proceed directly from the sermon to the prayers of the people.

The Dunedin gathering will be at the Diocesan Office in Green Island on Tuesday 12 April at 7 pm.

Electoral deadlock for next Tikanga Maori Bishop for the South Island The electoral college to select the successor to Bishop John Gray which met last week in Christchurch found itself unable to come to a clear decision after 8 ballots. The bench of Bishops will now choose another date for the Electoral College to reconvene and attempt to elect a new Bishop.

The reputation of Bishop Bell Until recently Bishop George Bell of Chichester was one of the heroes of 20th century Anglicanism. His early warnings against Hitler and assisting the escape of refugees from Nazi Germany, his connections with Dietrich Bonhoeffer and the plotters against Hitler, his opposition to the carpet bombing of German cities, and his early endorsement of the ecumenical movement made him much admired. Recently a woman has come forward who has claimed that he sexually interfered with her when she was a child. After investigation the diocese of Chichester has formally apologised to her and paid her compensation of 15,000 pounds. The follow on publicity has led to a number of schools and institutions named after him hastily renaming themselves. A group of academics, politicians, lawyers and church figures, including historian and Bell's biographer Andrew Chandler, have come forward to claim that the "valuable reputation of a great man has been carelessly destroyed, on the basis of slender evidence sloppily investigated." They point out that the investigation did not consult Bell's papers or diaries, and that a surviving member of Bell's staff found the survivor's claim "incredible." Like a number of major British institutions the C of E has found itself on the back foot for its failure to deal thoroughly and effectively with historic sex abuse cases. In its desire to enable the voices of survivors to be heard it has lowered the burden of proof required and is prepared to take complainants at their word without corroborating evidence. This has sharpened up its ability to deal with such cases but brings with it a follow on dilemma, how to act in accord with the principles of natural justice when the proceedings are heard behind closed doors with no-one to represent or defend the dead.
