<u>Parish forum</u> A parish forum will follow the 10.30 am Service this morning as we have the good fortune to have the Revd Jonathan Hicks with us today who is our new mission partner. He will be speaking about his new role as theological educator at the diocesan theological College on Malaita in the Solomons. Jonathan returned to Dunedin briefly for some health checks and we had the unexpected pleasure of his company at the Easter Vigil Service. We will use this opportunity to decide on a date and time for a

Requiem for Margery Palmer. If time permits the Vicar will give a preliminary briefing on the parish's financial situation.

<u>Evensong and Benediction</u> This evening at 5 pm followed by a social gathering in the lounge.

<u>Paradise and Calvary</u> Preparations are well under way for our special Easter season Service on Sunday 17 April at 5 pm in which we will reflect on four of John Donne's poems about death and resurrection. Some parishioners will be offering personal reflections on Easter themes.

Cathedral Choir to visit Last year we hosted the Christchurch Cathedral choir. This year we will host the Dunedin Cathedral choir and their organist and choir director George Chittenden. This will be for Evensong and Benediction on Sunday 6 November at 5 pm. On that occasion we will celebrate the Feast of the Dedication. A social gathering will follow afterwards so that we can mix and mingle with the choristers.

<u>Organist celebrity concert</u> Striking while the iron is hot the Vicar has asked the Cathedral organist to be our celebrity organist this year, following on from the success of the Douglas Mews concert that opened our 150th anniversary celebrations. George has agreed with enthusiasm. The concert is likely to be on a Saturday afternoon in October.

Way Forward gathering The Bishop is holding a series of meetings throughout the diocese ahead of the May meeting of the General Synod to discuss and confer with Otago Southland Anglicans about the Motion 30 Same Sex blessings proposal contained in the report of the Way Forward task group. The Dunedin gathering will be at the Diocesan Office in Green Island on Tuesday 12 April at 7 pm.

Easter holiday trading Amid considerable debate the government is moving to bring forward new legislation to reform the present Easter holiday trading hours. The Vicar has been mystified for some time now why New Zealand has the Easter season holiday at all when we are continually being told how secular New Zealand society is, and when there is no wider society sentimental connection beyond the churches for this major Christian festival as there is with Christmas. Also Sabbatarian notions of trading and entertainment shut downs on major Christian occasions have faded from most Christians' consciousness. There could be some difficulties for church attendance on Good Friday if this was a normal working day but much of this could be obviated if the sensible suggestion that we follow the Anzac day rules was adopted with shops re-opening in the afternoon. The unions and the labour party have a point that the Easter break is a valuable time for families to be together but this issue could be addressed by legislation that gave workers the right to opt out of working over the Easter weekend.
