Reflections on what is required to die well

Death itself does not frighten me so much as the thought of a long and feeble old age. The litany in the Prayer Book prays that we may be delivered from sudden death, but it means sudden and unprepared, and we are not meant to want to linger...More difficult is to learn to hand over to God one's willingness to be old and feeble, to enter a second childhood in which one loses all one's adult dignity, and is stripped of all one's painfully acquired knowledge, and has to begin all over again, at the mercy of other people...

My bodily life will be finished, and it will be a relief if the body is worn out, and the purpose of my life will have been achieved, and I shall be with God...I shall see him face to face. It will not be pleasant, for my sins have spoiled my taste for him. But I believe that he wills to cleanse me in the saving death of Jesus, and I know that I will to receive his cleansing love here, and there; now and then. Through his mercy I believe that I shall achieve my true end for which I was born, and towards which all my prayer and daily life have been pointing, the enjoyment of God for ever in communion with the blessed company of all faithful people.

<u>Paradise and Calvary</u> Preparations are well under way for our special Easter season Service on Sunday 17 April at 5 pm in which we will reflect on four of John Donne's poems about death and resurrection. Some parishioners will be offering personal reflections on Easter themes.

<u>Requiem for Margery Palmer</u> We will remember Margery Palmer with a Requiem Eucharist on Saturday 23 April at 10 am.

Day of intercession for the parish Margery's requiem will inaugurate the day of intercession for the parish in which the Church will be open from then on throughout the day so that parishioners can drop in for a time of private prayer, concluding with Evensong and Benediction at 4 pm. The day of intercession prepares for and undergirds the parish AGM, which follows the next day on Sunday 24 April, and the Stewardship programme that will run over the following two weeks.

<u>Cathedral Choir to visit</u> Last year we hosted the Christchurch Cathedral choir. This year we will host the Dunedin Cathedral choir and their organist and choir director George Chittenden.
