The paternity of Justin Welby The Archbishop of Canterbury has won widespread praise for the equanimity and generosity of spirit with which he has received the news that a DNA test proves that his biological father is Sir Anthony Montague Browne and not Gavin Welby who married his mother nine months before his birth. Justin has spoken often of his hard childhood raised by alcoholic and separated parents who were often not there for him. That he has emerged as balanced and high functioning as he is says a great deal about his intestinal fortitude and the depth of his faith. He declares that when he turned to Christ at the age of 19 he received a new identity in Christ and that is the one that matters. Jane Portal his mother and Anthony Montague Browne were part of the support staff around the ageing Prime Minister Winston Churchill in the 1950's.
