The implications for the parish of the new health and safety legislation were considered. David Hoskins was appointed the parish health and safety officer.

Anglican Consultative Council meeting concludes The ACC gathering in Lusaka, Zambia has committed itself to "walk together" with the Primates of the Anglican Communion in response to Archbishop Justin Welby's report on January's Primates' Gathering and Meeting in Canterbury, which called for "consequences" for the US-based Episcopal Church following its decision to change its regulations to allow same-sex marriage. Last week, the Bishop of Connecticut, the Rt Revd Ian Douglas, who had been widely expected to stand for election for the position of chair of the ACC, announced that he would not do so in keeping with the "walking together" decision of the Primates and the ACC.
