Holy Cross St Kilda to be de-consecrated Our neighbouring Anglican Church of Holy Cross St Kilda is soon to be secularised at a last Service to be held in the Church on Sunday 10 July. It ceased to be used for worship several years ago when an engineering assessment found it to be well below earthquake safety standards, and Holy Cross parishioners have been worshipping in the nearby hall since. St Peter's originally caused the Church to be built as a mission Church and Chapel of ease just before the First World War, and then permitted the parish to begin its independent existence in 1917. At present Holy Cross is part of the Southern Coastal Deanery, which includes St Mary's Mornington and Green Island.

<u>Teschemakers expedition</u> A parish outing to Teschemakers is planned for Saturday 1 October. Mass will be celebrated in the wonderful Chapel, lunch will follow on site at a cost of \$25 a head, there will be a tour, and then we will adjourn to the Victorian Warehouse Precinct of Oamaru.
