### Parish News

**Clergy conference** The Vicar will be attending the diocesan clergy conference from noon on Tuesday until Thursday afternoon. He will return home each evening and will clear the answer phone regularly. The theme of the clergy conference concerns the kind of diocese Dunedin conceives itself to be and the kind of Bishop it needs to elect.

**New arrival for the Hicks family** Emmanuel John was born to Tessa and Jonathan Hicks, the missionary family we support in the Solomons, in early June.

**Brass cleaning** There will be brass cleaning on Friday 24 June at 10.30 am – helpers most appreciated.

**Arrangements for the Parish Patronal Festival** St Peter's will celebrate its Patronal Festival next Sunday. We will gather at the Mornington Tavern for a parish lunch after the 10.30 am Service, and Evensong and Benediction will follow at 5 pm. Please put your name on the noticeboard in the Link if you intend to join us for the lunch so we can make the appropriate booking number.

**Vestry news** It was reported that further consultations are taking place with Delta regarding the possibility of trimming the tree trunk of the felled elm tree on Baker Street to make possible the realigning of the fence. (This happened on Thursday) Hospitality preparations for the light meal to follow the July Cathedral choir visit were considered. The Vicar and Wardens reported on a meeting they had that morning with representatives of Holy Cross parish and the Bishop about the possibility of Holy Cross parishioners having their Sunday Church Service at St Peter's each Sunday afternoon. This initiative had come about as a result of a suggestion from Tubby Hopkins who thought that the imminent sale of Holy Cross made this an opportune time for such an approach. The Holy Cross representatives will now discuss this possibility with their committee and may well ask the St Peter's Vicar and Wardens to meet with the Holy Cross congregation to further discuss the invitation. The Bishop and the St Peter's Vestry have endorsed the invitation.

**Sunday Serenade** A programme of art songs including the song cycle *Songs of Travel* (Vaughan Williams) organised by Arnold Bachop. St Peter's Church, Sunday 14 August 2.30 pm. Entry fee \$10 with proceeds going to St Peter's running costs.

**Musical weekend in July** The George Chittenden celebrity organ recital on Saturday 16 July at 2 pm has as its programme three sixteenth century pieces *Fantasia sexti toni* by John Bull, *Passacaglia D-moll* by Buxtehude, *Veni Creator* by Nicolas de Grigny, three Nordic compositions *Gammal fabodspsaln* by Oskar Lindberg, *Brudsmarsch fran Ostra Fagelvoik* by Olof Franke, *Varmlandsoisan* by Per Ostlund, and three pieces by Edward Elgar, *Chanson de Matin*, *Chanson de Nuit* and *Imperial March*. The entry fee is \$10. The Dunedin Cathedral Choir visit to St Peter's occurring the following day on Sunday 17 July for a 5 pm Service of Evensong and Benediction includes *Magnificat* and *Nunc Dimittis* by Rachmaninoff and *O Salutaris Hostia* and *Tantum Ergo* by Palestrina. Drinks and nibbles will follow so that we can meet the choir and its director.
