PARISH NEWS

<u>Parish Patronal Festival</u> Today we celebrate the solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles. Our 10.30 am Service begins with a procession around the Church which we invite you to join. Morning tea will not follow this Service as those of us who have booked in will gather at the Wharf (note change of venue) for a parish lunch.

<u>Evensong and Benediction</u> Our Patronal Festival celebration continues this evening with Evensong and Benediction at 5 pm followed by a social gathering in the lounge.

<u>Rock</u> Copies of the new edition of the Rock can be uplifted from either the Link or at the back of the Church.

<u>Vicar in Auckland</u> The Vicar will be in Auckland for much of the coming week to give a paper at a theology conference at Carey Baptist Theological College. This gathering brings together many of the Systematic Theologians, Old and New Testament scholars and Missiologists of New Zealand.

<u>Frances Hodgkins</u> The Frances Hodgkins house group will meet a week earlier than usual on Monday 4 July at 2 pm in the Garden Lounge, with the Frances Hodgkins Eucharist that same week on Thursday 7 July at 11 am. At the house group gathering we will view the final episode of "Churches; how to Read them" that considers the effect of the Oxford Movement on Church design.

Vestry news It was reported that further consultations are taking place with Delta regarding the possibility of trimming the tree trunk of the felled elm tree on Baker Street to make possible the realigning of the fence. (This happened on Thursday)Hospitality preparations for the light meal to follow the July Cathedral choir visit were considered. The Vicar and Wardens reported on a meeting they had had that morning with representatives of Holy Cross parish and the Bishop about the possibility of Holy Cross parishioners having their Sunday Church Service at St Peter's each Sunday afternoon. This initiative had come about as a result of a suggestion from Tubby Hopkins who thought that the imminent sale of Holy Cross made this an opportune time for such an approach. The Holy Cross representatives will now discuss this possibility with their committee and may well ask the St Peter's Vicar and Wardens to meet with the Holy Cross congregation to further discuss the invitation. The Bishop and the St Peter's Vestry have endorsed the invitation.
