<u>Second Caversham lecture confirmed</u> The second of this year's Caversham lectures on Tuesday 8 November will be given by Len Cook, New Zealand's Families Commissioner and Chairman of the Social Policy Research and Evaluation Unit. His topic is *Child Welfare – Can We Deliver and How Will We Know?* Len is a University of Otago graduate who was a former government statistician and Statistics New Zealand chief executive. His talk will provide insights on the government's determination to replace *Child Youth and Family* with a more effective agency and to measure outcomes of child intervention initiatives in a more effective way so as to find out what works.
