Vestry news Two further initiatives for the de-mossing of the Church roof were agreed to. The Synod representatives reported on last weekend's Synod in Invercargill. A memorandum from the diocese was considered regarding the recording of clergy sick leave and annual leave. It would be necessary to draw up a covenant regarding issues such as clergy leave, allowances, and attendance at conferences. It was agreed that the parish would financially underwrite the bus trip so that the Teschemakers outing could proceed. It was resolved that the fate of the stained glass windows at Holy Cross, St Kilda was a conservation issue for that parish to resolve with St Peters being available to help if that was requested. Last month's election of Tubby Hopkins as a replacement Synods person was reviewed and confirmed.

Teschemakers expedition Please come to Baker St by 9.15 for a 9.30 start to our next Saturday expedition to Teschemakers. Please bring \$40 cash with you to pay for the \$15 bus tariff and the \$25 lunch. We expect to arrive around 11 and will proceed straight to the Chapel for the celebration of the Eucharist. Lunch will follow at 12 with time for inspecting the house and the grounds before and after that. We will then proceed to the Harbour Street precinct in Oamaru for some shopping and sightseeing. We expect to be back home around 4.30-5.

Synod news Much debate centred around Statute 14 that governs how the parish diocesan contributions are worked out, and its reform to change the formula for this calculation. In future parishes will be assessed by the simple formula of income only. This means that our parish contribution, which remains for this year at the low level it has for some years of just over \$4,000, will double next year to around \$8,000. After some procedural confusion and an intervention by the Bishop a measure was passed that requires equal men/women representation on the diocesan nominators panel, the group that assists parishes to choose their next Vicar. After some debate the Trust Board motion requesting that 25% of future land and buildings sales go the capital base of the Bishopric estate was withdrawn and incorporated into the Missions Committee motion requiring that 100% of such sales goes into the diocesan mission fund. Some features of the Trust Board motion were incorporated into this measure whereby the Bishopric fund can benefit from these sales to some extent and the exceptive clause that parishes will be exempt from the levy in situations where they are realigning their property portfolio in such a way as to make the operation of their parish more efficient. A Synods person requested much more informative reporting to Synod from the Trust Board regarding its share portfolio and the degree to which it is ethically invested. The Vicar undertook to meet with the Synods person and to bring a higher level of such reporting to the next Synod. The business of Synod was concluded by 4pm on Saturday. The Sunday session turned into a break up into small groups for a hearing, caring sharing session about the future of the diocese. The Caversham representatives made an early and graceful exit from such a group therapy approach to diocesan decision making.
