Advice about prayer Today's sermon is entitled "Prayer that changes things." I offer some advice about prayer to accompany it. Set time aside for prayer at your best times in the day or night when you are most alert, not in your down times. Prayer is about being connected to God, in contact, sometimes without word or images or ideas. It nurtures the sense of the presence of God in our lives. Without the habit of daily prayer God can feel distant, a reality that we are not sure about. To come into the presence of God and still the distracted and over-thinking mind have some helpful resource to hand that can assist with this - the repetition of a line from a hymn, a phrase from the Sunday Scripture readings, gazing at a lit candle, using a rosary. In praying for others be organised and thoughtful so that you don't just end up praying for the usual small number of people. Perhaps a notebook divided into the days of the week in which we list different people each day from our family, friendship world, our parish, and the concerns we have for the wider world. A way of praying for others that I find helpful is to recreate in my imagination Andrei Rublev's icon of the Trinity, and then to place in the midst of the Triune figures my recollected memory of the person I am praying for. Before asking for things from God never forget to praise him and thank him. Prayer is the language of love, of adoration, of gratitude and when we do this the exchange of love between him and us can begin and become perceptible to us.
