Final Caversham Lecture This Tuesday Evening.

The fifth Caversham lecture on Tuesday evening at 7.30 pm in the Parish Lounge is entitled "Exploring and Exploiting the Secrets of Life itself: wonderful possibilities and potential perils." Bio-ethicist and St Matthews's parishioner Don Evans will examine the life enhancing and life extending possibilities of current stem cell research and the ethical dilemmas they present.

Episcopal election Archbishop Phillip Richardson has appointed Bishop Jim White, the assistant Bishop of Auckland, to be the bishop who will preside over Dunedin's episcopal electoral Synod. It is anticipated that this will be held a month or two after Bishop Kelvin retires at the end of April 2017.

Diocesan overview As the year draws to a close there has been good news for the diocese in a number of key appointments with Selwyn College having appointed James Lovelock, who is at present the legal manager of Webb Farry, manager of the Otago Volts cricket team and a Presbyterian Elder, as its new Warden, together with the recent institution of the Revd Gary Griffiths-Smith to Gore. Gary had an outstanding ministry at St Matthews Dunedin in former years. Two promising young clergy have been priested this year, Max Whitaker who is at Holy Trinity Invercargill at present and Brett Roberts who is curate of St Johns Roslyn. The Revd Vivienne Galletly will retire from Milton-Tuapeka next month. Henceforth the parish will no longer have a resident Vicar with the Vicarage being sold and Sunday Services being provided by a priest from a neighbouring parish. The Revd Ruth Doig has retired from Port Chalmers with the Revd Esther Clark-Prebble providing interim ministry until a new part time appointment can be made there.
