The tension between being a national church and a diocesan **church** The Anglican church inherited from its parent church the western Catholic Church a diocesan structure. "Diocese" is a term inherited from the Roman Empire denoting an administrative unit covering a considerable geographical area. Throughout its history so far the Anglican Church in these islands has been very enthusiastic about diocesan autonomy to the detriment of a sense of national loyalty and identity giving cursory attention to Provincial institutions such as the General Synod. Bishop Nevill, Dunedin's first Bishop, was particularly hot on this theme though ironically he became the Primate of the New Zealand Anglican Church towards the end of his long episcopal reign. The effect of this as Noel Derbyshire, historian of the New Zealand Anglican church, has pointed out was to create a church consisting of seven mini-denominations each with a distinctive diocesan culture presided over by its respective Bishop who was jealous of its relative independence. A follow on result was duplication and financial inefficiencies as each diocese had to create and service its own administrative and financial support services. Not only was this wasteful but it also resulted in lost opportunities in mission since resources and money did not go to those parts of the country that particularly needed new ministries, church start-ups or the maintenance of struggling and vulnerable parishes. It is therefore ironic to say the least that the diocese of Dunedin has now become enthusiastic about the national church, through the agency of the St Johns College Trust Board, providing the necessary finance to top its Bishopric estate to the point where an episcopal election can be held next year. It also sets an interesting precedent for the years ahead for the other small struggling Pakeha dioceses.
