<u>Bishop Kelvin</u> This morning we welcome Fr Chris Holmes as the celebrant and preacher at our morning Services. Chris teaches Systematic Theology at the Otago theology department and is a parishioner of St Johns Roslyn. He has kindly stepped in to the breach at short notice when Bishop Kelvin found that he had double booked himself. Fr Hugh is attending the 150<sup>th</sup> celebrations of St Mary's Addington where he was the Vicar for 9 years.

<u>Five Unusual Documentaries</u> Our season of documentaries continues tomorrow night 20 February with **Metroland** and

**Night Mail:** John Betjeman nostalgically recalls the Metropolitan Line of his youth that passed through Bucks, Herts and Middlesex, which has now morphed into part of the London tube system. "Night Mail" was a critically acclaimed doco of the GPO Film Unit made in the 1930's about the night train that steamed through the night from London Euston to Crewe, Glasgow, Edinburgh and Aberdeen while on board mail sorters toiled to process the mail that was being continually taken on board and off loaded. The final memorable section has music by Benjamin Britten and a poem by W H Auden. This will be in the Vicarage at 7 pm.

One more for luck The documentary film season will be extended by one week with the screening on Monday night 27 February of "Never Stand Still," an insider's look at the Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival. Jacob's Pillow is a dance studio in the Berkshires that brings together the best of the contemporary dance world both in America and from across the world.

Harvest Festival St Peter's will celebrate Harvest Festival next Sunday. Agnes and some of her students will be singing the John Rutter anthem "For the Beauty of the Earth" during communion. If you would you like to join this group for this special occasion please make yourself known to Agnes or David. <u>Celebrity Organ recital</u> This year's St Peter's celebrity organ recital will be on Saturday 15 July with our guest organist being John Linker, the music director at the Christchurch transitional Cathedral.

He will preside and preach here at St Peter's on Sunday 26 November, the feast of Christ the King. Two days later he will give the last of the Caversham lectures for 2017 on the current state of Anglican Roman Catholic relations.
