**Today's poem** John Drury writes, "The subject of "The Glance" is eye contact, as important as it is unspoken in the everyday communication of person with person. The first verse shows Herbert's ability to recapture past feeling, the overpowering delight of adolescent religious emotion, in all its original reality. It is followed in the second verse by recollection of sadder times when its power was reduced to that of memory. In the third verse the singular "I" is superseded by the plural "we" as the poet becomes maturely social and projects his theme into future, ultimate and steady bliss. Only at the end is the full content and possibility of the theme, the kindly eye, realised. The captivating image "when thou shalt look us out of pain" has a homely suggestion of a comforting mother cheering up her hurt child with sympathetically coaxing smiles. The reference to a "thousand suns" in the last lines is a reference to the final vision in the book of Revelation where "God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes" in the heavenly city, where "they shall need no candle, neither light of the sun; for the Lord God giveth them light."

Ministers association meeting reflections Last Wednesday the Vicar attended the local Ministers Association meeting to meet Nick Orbell, the new DCC community development worker for the area. This had been billed as an opportunity to hear the DCC's plans to regenerate South D. Yet as the meeting went on no such plan was unveiled. Instead we heard of the community development worker's assignment being to develop "resilience" within the different local communities so as to be able to cope with future challenging incidents. Questions were asked about the slowness of the DCC to create a "Hub" for the area and we were told that one of the challenges was the number of quality businesses taking up premises in King Edward St thus making it harder to find a suitable site for the "Hub." Apparently a local newsletter had been launched entitled "The Lowdown" but its initial circulation had been limited. The Vicar gave his e mail contact details so as to be able to access it in the future. Some discussion centred around the DCC's struggles to overcome its past reputation for incompetence and dysfunction. Fr Gerard Aynsley spoke of a perceived disconnect between what local elected representatives promised and what officials and departments were actually prepared to do. Elected representatives had expressed strong support for the St Patricks Basilica redevelopment, especially of a proposed accompanying community green space, yet when it came to approaching the relevant DCC department all requests for assistance had been stonewalled.
