Atonement theories do not claim to define or explain the inner mechanics of salvation. They seek to express in limited analogical language the reality of God's decisive act on behalf of a broken world. There was some kind of victory that took place, some kind of power shift in the universe, some kind of ransom paid, some kind of healing initiated, some ultimate kind of love displayed, some kind of dramatic rescue effected. Of course, the terrible paradox of the Christian faith is that this rescue, this victory, this healing happened because of a death - a notorious execution. This is the dark mystery of the Atonement. No theory of the atonement can effectively account for that central paradox. Rather, the range of atonement theories attempt to focus our attention, illuminate the truth and point beyond themselves to God.

now begun the preliminary work on the installation. This should be completed in two to three weeks' time. We are hoping to have a joint Service with the Holy Cross parishioners in which we host them for a dedication of the window and a recalling of the shared history of our two parishes on Sunday 7 May. The Holy Cross parishioners will be with us for our Good Friday Service.

Paving stones for the wilderness garden Fredericka Schmaltz, who leads an art class in our hall, has created a wilderness garden for us out of the piece of untended ground by the kitchen. It is on the road to becoming a most attractive part of our church gardens. She now recommends that we create a pathway through it to make it more accessible and useable. Dunedin roofing systems had fixed the leak in the Vicarage chimney but a new leak had developed in a different part of the Vicarage roof.

The hounding of Bishop Philip North Bishop Philip North was recently chosen to be the next Bishop of Sheffield, a move away from his present role as Bishop of Burnley. A traditionalist Anglo-Catholic he is opposed to the ordination of women but is happy with female leadership in the church and has co-existed with women clergy on his patch in an amicable and co-operative way. This is the way things are supposed to be under the accord that cleared the way for women bishops in the church - traditionalist would have an honoured place in the church and would not be marginalised onto a reservation for dead-enders. Moreover North has earned a reputation as the defender of the church's mission on sink-hole estates and the bad lands of northern cities. He wants priests to avoid becoming chaplains only to the leafy suburbs and the gin and jag parishes. But he has withdrawn his acceptance of the new bishopric after a campaign of public hounding and opposition from women clergy within Sheffield diocese and from prominent liberals such as Martin Percy, the Dean of Christ Church Oxford. This is the second time he has been blocked in such a way as his proposed translation to Whitby was also frustrated by a similar though less vitriolic campaign. The Archbishop of York is dismayed and Bishop Pete Broadbent of Willesden has denounced the exclusive "inclusives" and has said that "we're all in trouble" if there was not future in the church for traditionalist Catholics. During the controversy Bishop North's candidature for Sheffield was supported by 23 women priests in his own diocese and by three woman bishops. The Church of England is now finding out what some of us have known for a long time - there is nothing more intolerant than an "inclusive" liberal in full cry.
