Record numbers visit St Luke's Oamaru The Oamaru Mail reports that it is estimated that more than 40,000 people have visited St Luke's Anglican Church Oamaru since late 2002 when a volunteer group, calling itself Steeple people, was formed to open the Church to visitors. They also act as tour guides answering questions and pointing out areas of interest. The Church was temporarily closed after an act of vandalism so the volunteer group came into being to enable it to be regularly open to the public with a particular view to making it available to the many tourists who pass through the Harbour Street Victorian precinct nearby. "Recently the 4,000th visitor in the 2016-17 season, a French tourist, passed through," the visitor season running from October to April. Chinese tourists are the biggest visitor group, followed by Germans, and then New Zealanders. Japanese visitors have been moved to note a small outdoor memorial dedicated to those who died in the atomic bombing of Hiroshima in 1945. Apparently tourists regularly attend the Church's regular Services. Visitor numbers have increased year by year. This initiative is a small part of Oamaru's growing reputation as the little town that could with many locals getting behind the revitalisation of the Victorian Harbour St Precinct and the development of quite a number of appropriate and interesting shops. This is a town that has found its mojo, its distinctive charisma that marks it out from other provincial centres and makes it a place where travellers want to stop and explore and spend.
