77% submissions against euthanasia Care alliance volunteers have carried out an analysis of the submissions to the parliamentary select committee on voluntary euthanasia and have found that 16,411 of the submissions are opposed with 4,142 in favour. The voluntary euthanasia society complained of the possibility of postcard type opposition submissions but the overwhelming majority were lengthy and detailed (The Vicar was one of them). While 8,975 people signed the voluntary euthanasia society's petition less than half of them bothered to put in a submission. It is clear to this observer that there is a real media bias in this country in favour of euthanasia that amplifies the opinions of a militant minority.
