2017 St Peter's Organ recital

The third of our annual organ recitals will take place on **Saturday 15 July at 1.00 pm** when we host John Linker, organist and music director of the Christchurch Transitional Cathedral. The programme will begin with J.S. Bach's *Prelude and Fugue A-moll,* BWV 543 and then his *O Mensch, bewein dein Sunde gross* from the *Little Organ Book.* Two 19th century pieces then follow, Felix Mendelssohn's *Sonata 3, Opus 65, Number 3* and Robert Schumann's *Fugue 1 on B-A-C-H.* The second half of the programme is taken up with 20th century works Jan Nieland's *Prelude, Choral and Variations,* Dan Locklair's *The Peace may be exchanged* (from the Rubrics of the American Episcopal Prayer Book), Leo Sowerby's *Carillion* and two movements from Louis Vierne's *Organ Symphony number 3.* The programme thus includes German, Dutch, French and American composers for the organ.

A New Bishop for Dunedin

Last Sunday, Archbishops Winston Halapua and Philip Richardson announced the election of the Rev Dr Steven Benford as the next Bishop of Dunedin. They confirmed his election, which has been ratified by General Synod, after he was nominated by the Diocese of Dunedin's Electoral College held from May 26-27. It is an appointment which signals a return to New Zealand for the doctor who has worked for 29 years in medicine, specialising in anaesthetics since 1990. In the early 1990's, he and wife Lorraine (who was born in Dunedin and grew up in Gore) brought their young family to Otago. From 1991-1995 Fr Steven worked as a GP in Oamaru where he also established a free medical clinic. He also worked oneday a week at Dunedin Hospital. In the last 6 months of his New Zealand stay, Fr Steven served in the emergency dept of Tokoroa Hospital after which he, Lorraine and family returned to the UK. Responding to a call to ordained ministry, he was ordained in York in 2000.

Bishop-elect Steven, who is 56, currently serves as vicar of St Joseph the Worker, Northolt, in the Diocese of London, where he is also a Bishop's Advisor for Ministry, a new incumbents ministry mentor and spiritual director.

Fr Steven's ordination as Bishop of Dunedin will take place in St Paul's Cathedral in September.
