2017 St Peter's Organ Recital

The third of our annual organ recitals will take place on **Saturday 15 July at 1.00 pm** when we host **John Linker**, organist and music director of the **Christchurch Transitional Cathedral**. The programme will begin with J.S. Bach's *Prelude and Fugue A-moll, BWV 543* and then his *O Mensch, bewein dein Sunde gross* from the *Little Organ Book*. Two 19th century pieces then follow, Felix Mendelssohn's *Sonata 3, Opus 65, Number 3* and Robert Schumann's *Fugue 1 on B-A-C-H*. The second half of the programme is taken up with 20th century works Jan Nieland's *Prelude, Choral and Variations*, Dan Locklair's *The Peace may be exchanged* (from the Rubrics of the American Episcopal Prayer Book), Leo Sowerby's *Carillion* and two movements from Louis Vierne's *Organ Symphony number 3*. The programme thus includes German, Dutch, French and American composers for the organ

Church of England wins ExxonMobil climate change battle.

Shareholders of the oil giant ExxonMobil pushed through a resolution on climate change at the company's AGM recently despite strong opposition from the Board of Directors. The motion, tabled by the Church Commissioners', the financial arm of the Church of England, with the New York State Comptroller, will require the company to provide annual reports on showing how the business will be affected by global efforts to reduce climate change. The move comes as US President Donald Trump prepares to pull out of the Paris Agreement, in which global leaders agreed efforts to cap global temperature at 2 degrees Celsius. The ExxonMobil motion won the support of 62.3% of shareholders.

In a speech to shareholders, the Church Commissioners' head of responsible investment, Edward Mason, criticised the company's non-executive directors for their stance. He asked, "Members of the board, do you leave your understanding of climate change at the door when you attend ExxonMobil board meetings?" Speaking later in response to the vote, Mason said, "This is an historic vote - despite strong opposition from the Board, the majority of Exxon's shareholders have sent an unequivocal signal to the company that it must do much more to disclose the impact on its business of measures to combat climate change". The Church Commissioners manage the Church of England's historic endowments - now valued at some 7.9 million pounds.
