Episcopal ordination date Our Bishop elect Fr Steven Benford will be ordained at St Paul's Cathedral on Friday 22 September at 7.30 pm. We are strongly encouraged to attend this Service. **Synod** The Diocesan Synod meets the following day Saturday 23 September in our hall. This will be a one day Synod only. **Welcoming the new Bishop** Bishop Steven Benford will preach and preside at the St Peter's 10.30 Solemn Sung

Eucharist on Sunday 24 September. This will be his first worship leading engagement in the diocese.

Episcopal arrival plans The Benfords will make landfall in New Zealand on 6 September in Auckland where Lorraine's sister lives and will then motor down through the country meeting the New Zealand bishops as they go. They plan to live in rental accommodation in Dunedin for the first six months of their time here until they find a suitable house to purchase.

<u>The return of Fr Chris Holmes</u> Parishioners have been enquiring when Fr Chris Holmes will be taking the Sunday Services again here at St Peter's. Chris is booked in next for Sunday 1 October, the Sunday after the big Synod/Pontifical High Mass weekend.

Motion 29 Working Group Parishioners may recall that the last General Synod deadlocked on the issue of same sex blessings, resolved to let the controversial Motion 30 lie on the table, and set up a working group to bring fresh proposals to the 2018 General Synod. These came out in the past week. Central to them is that the decision as to whether or not to authorise same sex blessings in a diocese would rest with the diocesan Bishop, who if he or she proposed to do so would then authorise certain clergy to be the approved celebrants of these Services. These could only take place if the couples had been duly married under civil law, if the Vestry had been consulted and their advice given in good faith, and if the Service was in a form authorised by the Bishop. This is significant in that the Province would not be producing an authorised liturgy for this purpose. The authors of the report insist that the Church's doctrine of marriage would not change. They also propose that clergy and office holders would no longer be required to declare a signed submission to the authority of the General Synod but would rather assent to the Constitution and Code of Canons and would agree to be bound by the decisions of the Church's decision making bodies. At first glance this appears to be a better outcome than many had expected but there are of course fish hooks in it. Presumably if the Bishop changes then potentially the decision to allow or disallow same sex blessings in a diocese could change with the new Bishop. Presumably gay civilly married couples in a non-authorising diocese would have to travel to an authorising diocese to get their union blessed. What if they returned and then one of them presented themselves to the examining chaplains as a potential ordinand? And of course can the Church truly say that its doctrine of marriage remains unchanged if it permits same sex blessings in some jurisdictions.
