On the Image and Likeness of God

For those whom God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. And those whom God predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justifies; and those whom he justified he also glorified.

Big Eucharistic weekend Our Bishop elect Fr Steven Benford has decided to open Synod by celebrating a Eucharist at St Peter's with a rite of his choice at which he will give his charge on Saturday 23 September. The next morning he will of course preside and preach at our 10.30 Parish Eucharist.

The mysterious death of Fr Woodhouse Parishioners will recall the dedication ceremony we had earlier this year for the newly installed Woodhouse stained glass window in the Link. It had formerly been the main window above the altar of Holy Cross St Kilda in recognition of a former curate of St Peter's who had done much to get the Anglican community established in St Kilda, thus preparing the ground for the establishment of Holy Cross St Kilda. After leaving Caversham Woodhouse was for some years the Vicar of Balclutha and then became the Vicar of St Mary's Mornington. In 1914 he went to stay with his country friends the Andersons to share with them the news of his recent engagement and to get over a recent illness. After a week's stay he resolved to visit a friend in Balclutha and set off walking over muddy roads intent on crossing the Molyneux River. His body was found some weeks later on a snag in the river. He had been insured against accidental death for 500 pounds but the company refused to pay out on the grounds that this was not an accident within the terms of the policy and that Woodhouse had probably fallen to his death while trying to cross the railway bridge, an unlawful act of trespass. The Public Trust as executor of his will took the insurance company to court in June 1915 in a case widely reported in Dunedin's newspapers. The Public Trust won based on the evidence of Mr Anderson who had tracked his guest's footprints to a bank on the side of the road from which he would have slipped off into the river. Thus Woodhouse would not have reached the railway bridge or fallen from it. Described as "a delicate man of nervous temperament" he was also short of stature with small feet who none the less had remarkable endurance and was known to set off to visit Balclutha parishioners in distress no matter how bad the roads or stormy the nights.
