Commentary on today's gospel reading

In a time and place (today in the West) where an "easy" universalism is fashionable and claims about the divine election of peoples and persons are regarded with suspicion or even revulsion, it is important to help others grasp the biblical doctrine of the chosen people. If one wishes to be true to the biblical witness, it is necessary to present clearly what the Scriptures say about the chosenness of Israel and how Christians share in it through Jesus. The God of Jesus is the God of Israel. Gentiles call upon and experience this God through Jesus as representative of the Jewish people. The roots of Christianity are Jewish. Gentile Christians have been grafted onto the olive tree (see Romans 11: 17, 24).
