<u>Pray for those whose anniversary occurs at this time</u> John Larkins, Robert Gardner, Ouie Garrod, and Rona Hitchox Time to elect new Pihopa Te Runanganui, the biennial Synod of the Anglican Maori Church, will met at the Whakatu Marae in Nelson from 7 to 10 September to elect the successor to Archbishop Brown Turei as the new Pihopa, the Bishop of Aotearoa. The Electoral College will be chaired by emeritus bishop John Paterson, formerly bishop of Auckland and before that secretary to the Pihopatanga for nine years. The five candidates are the five Maori bishops Kito Pikaahu, Ngarahu Katene, Don Tamihere, Muru Walters and Richard Wallace. Considerations of age and infirmity mean that there are likely to be only two main contenders, Don Tamihere the new bishop of the North Island east coast region and Kito Pikaahu who has been bishop of the far north for some time.
