<u>Vestry news</u> It was resolved to move the Corstorphine Church Fund and the Sundry Endowment Fund into the St Peter's Renovation Fund. The Renovation Fund is invested in the Trust Board's Growth Fund, a unitised trust that is focused on capital growth. It is the reserve we are building up to deal with earthquake strengthening or sudden maintenance emergencies. The hall needs new lightweight tables and the search is on for suitable replacement tables.

Primates' meeting The Primates of the Anglican Communion will gather at Canterbury from 2 to 6 October. Their last gathering in January 2016 was something of a triumph for the Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby in getting the Primates to promise to "walk together" in the face of what appeared to be intolerable tensions over the subject of human sexuality. Furthermore there was an agreement that there should be a series of Primatial meetings in the lead up to the next and crucial meeting of the Lambeth Conference of Bishops in 2020. Storm clouds are gathering ahead of the October meeting with the Archbishop of Nigeria, the new head of GAFCON, vowing that he will boycott the meeting. GAFCON will have its own worldwide gathering next year. Their complaint is that the last Primatial meeting had little effect in restraining certain western Provinces in pressing ahead with controversial and potentially Communion breaking moves. Canada and Scotland have joined America in authorising church gay marriages, the American Episcopal Church is preparing to revise its marriage rites in a non-gender specific direction and at the recent gathering of the Church of England's General Synod conservative speakers were booed by the LGBTI supporters. An interesting issue for Justin Welby to tackle will be the status accorded to Archbishop Foley Beach, the leader of the Anglican Church of North America, the breakaway variety of North American Anglicanism from the Episcopal Church. He was present at the last gathering and his presence helped to keep conservatives on side. This writer is puzzled and exasperated by the boycott tactics of GAFCON. If they stay in the conversation they have the numbers in the end to prevail in the counsels of the Lambeth Conference and at the last Primatial gathering they managed to persuade some of the undecided and under informed Provinces as to what had been going on behind the scenes to come on side with them.
