The largest New Zealand Anglican financial entity The diocese of Auckland is of course the largest Anglican diocese in the country. Its financial operations are conducted by Trust Management, an entity that it owns. Recently the diocese of Waikato has devolved its financial operations to Trust Management thus enabling its diocesan office to be very minimally staffed. There is a certain logic to this as the diocese of Waikato was originally spun off from the diocese of Auckland. However, Trust Management is about more than just accounting and payroll services. It is now also into the business of property investment through its ancillary arm called Property Trust whose mixture of ground leases include buildings in the vicinity of Auckland Airport. It is a unitised trust offering other financial entities the opportunity to invest in it and thus grow its portfolio. With total assets of around \$137 million this is a financial entity with considerable potential. In the years ahead smaller struggling diocese may find the logic of coming under its umbrella compelling, especially the diocese of Waiapu. The Trust Management web site doesn't state its connection to the Anglican diocese of Auckland in immediately explicit terms but it does make it clear that it is interested in providing financial services to charities. Clearly this is a financial entity to be watched with interest in the years ahead. A somewhat parallel development is the way in which Selwyn Villages, the large Auckland Diocese rest home operator, is reaching out to Anglican rest homes across the country offering to either manage them or take them over. There is a compelling logic to this as the years ahead will see the picking off and closing down of small rest home operators and the growing power of the conglomerates in the field.
