The ruining of a reputation Until recently Bishop George Bell was one of the most admired Anglicans of the 20th century. A supporter of Dietrich Bonhoeffer and the Confessing Church he was one of the first to alert the outside world to the truth of what Nazi Germany was up to, and later took a leading role in assisting the refugee resettlement of Jewish children to Britain before the war. During the war he opposed in the House of Lords Britain's carpet bombing of German cities. He was also a notable ecumenist. After his death in 1958 a Church of England School in the diocese of Chichester was named after him and he was given a special name day in the C of E's calendar of Christians of note. Then last year it was announced that a complainant under the pseudonym of "Carol" had on the balance of probabilities been sexually abused by Bell when she was 9 years old. The C of E issued an apology to her and paid her 16,800 pounds in reparation. Supporters of Bell were outraged and challenged the legality of the proceedings that had been shrouded in secrecy. In response an independent review was carried out by Lord Carlile who found serious shortcomings in the procedures employed. He noted that noone had been appointed to represent Bell's interests, that his domestic Chaplain who had seen him all day every day in the period in question had not been approached, and that the case relied heavily on "recovered memories," an unreliable source in those over 63 where there is no corroborating evidence. Had the case gone to court it would in all probability have failed. The Archbishop of Canterbury and the Bishop of Chichester have apologised for the shortcomings in the procedures employed but stand by the decision reached and the public naming of Bell. Meanwhile the school named after him has had an abrupt name change and portraits of him have been taken down.
