New Pihopa After a considerable delay of 6 months in confirming the appointment it has been announced that Bishop Don Tamihere of Te Tairawhiti (the area around Gisborne and the east coast of the North Island) is to be next Pihopa O Aotearoa. At 45 he will be the youngest Archbishop in the Anglican Communion.

Christchurch Diocesan Synod affirms Motion 29 Last weekend a one day session of the Christchurch Diocesan Synod affirmed Motion 29 ahead of the General Synod debate on same sex blessings in May. Their 2017 Synod was dominated by the Cathedral rebuild issue and they felt it important to give due care and attention in debating time to what could be one of the most momentous changes in the history of New Zealand Anglican Church. Given how rushed and dominated by other business Dunedin's 2017 Synod was we should, in my humble opinion, do likewise. Given that Motion 29 does not involve any proposed change to the formularies, the legislation covering forms of Service, there may well be no opportunity for further debate on the issue at the September Synod.
