Impending developments The large parish of St Johns, Latimer Square, Christchurch has made the decision to depart from the Anglican Church in the wake of the same sex blessings decision of the General Synod. There is a distinct possibility that St Stephens, Shirley and St Matthews, Dunedin will follow suit. Now attention turns to the GAFCON gathering in Jerusalem from 17-22 June at which 56 New Zealand Anglicans will be present. Will the decision be made there to provide for a Missionary Bishop for New Zealand to exercise Episcopal leadership over the biblically orthodox former Anglicans as they slip their moorings in a slow and steady trickle?

Resignation of Dean Last Sunday Trevor James announced that he would step down as of this Sunday "for health reasons." The Cathedral has been in a parlous state for some time with miniscule congregations and an almost invisible profile in the diocese and with the city. The music director George Chittenden was not replaced when he left for his new job in Sweden and the Cathedral has been making do with temporary organists. The Bishop has appointed himself temporary priest in charge.

Protest meeting about proposed closure of South Dunedin Kiwibank and Post Shop The Vicar attended a protest meeting last Tuesday that aims to mobilise public opinion against the proposed closure of what is the busiest retail outlet in South Dunedin. Concerns were raised about the many elderly people or poor people who do not have access to internet banking and who rely on the many bill payment services provided by Kiwibank and Post Shop. The Vicar made the point that this is not just a generational issue as the other outlet marked for closure (close by the University) is used by many young adults. It was suggested that if the branch closes its functions could be moved in to the proposed South Dunedin hub. Kiwibank was originally founded by Jim Anderton as "the people's bank" that would behave differently from the Australian owned banks but it seems to have lost its original vision. A petition will soon be circulated here at St Peter's for you to sign. You can also write to Winston Peters who is the Kiwibank Minister. Remember that you don't have to attach a stamp when writing to an MP and that New Zealand First has promised to be good to the regions. One final thought - the South Dunedin shops are a shadow of what they once were. This closure could be their death knell.
