When the people are gathered for worship, Deacons are authorised to read the Holy Scriptures, lead the prayers, and distribute the bread and wine of Holy Communion.

Local Lives: A History of Addington is the title of a history book to be launched at the end of June. The Christchurch suburb of Addington has many parallels with Caversham. Both were large working class communities dominated by local railway workshops as the primary employer in which local men assessed one another as to where they stood in the skills hierarchy of industrial civilization. Author John Wilson has used the same techniques as the Otago history department's Caversham project in which certain streets and their residents were subjected to detailed examination in a ground up approach to historical scholarship. A poster advertising the book can be found on the community noticeboard in the Link. The Vicar recalls his 9 years as Vicar of St Mary's Addington as being amongst the most turbulent and rewarding of his ministry.

Proposed closure of South Dunedin Kiwibank and Post Shop petition Please consider signing the petition against the proposed closure of what is the busiest retail outlet in South Dunedin. This would negatively impact the many elderly people or poor people who do not have access to internet banking and who rely on the many bill payment services provided by Kiwibank and Post Shop and might also sound the death knell of the local shopping centre. Kiwibank was originally founded by Jim Anderton as "the people's bank" that would behave differently from the Australian owned banks but it seems to have lost its original vision. You can also write to Winston Peters who is the Kiwibank Minister. Remember that you don't have to attach a stamp when writing to an MP and that New Zealand First has promised to be good to the regions.
