News from home and abroad Bishop Steven Benford will be in Britain for the next three weeks presiding at the wedding of one of his sons in York. The Revd Brett Roberts was instituted to the parish of Balclutha last Monday. Bishop Victoria Matthews threw her hat in the ring during the electoral process for the next Bishop of Toronto but came second in the election. She was a suffragan of Toronto at the beginning of her episcopal career. A special general meeting of St Stephens Shirley has voted to leave the Anglican Church with only five parishioners voting to remain with the diocese of Christchurch. Nominations for the next bishop of Christchurch have opened and will close at the end of this month. The electoral Synod will meet in August. The GAFCON conference begins in Jerusalem today with 2,000 Anglicans expected to attend from 43 countries. 58 New Zealanders will be present. There is speculation that the Global South Primates will announce at that gathering the provision of episcopal oversight for New Zealand Anglican parishes and parishioners who leave the Anglican Church of Aotearoa New Zealand.

Were you an Anglican debutante? For many years the diocese of Dunedin held an annual debutante ball at which young Anglican women were presented to the Bishop and so "came out," in the innocent years when the term meant something else. The Vicar is collecting photos of former parish debutantes to scan in to the parish archive as part of the bringing together of material for the parish history.
