The organisers were disappointed that no Anglo-Catholics turned up so its constituency has been mostly conservative evangelicals. Several agendas are playing out in this gathering. There are those who think it is time that leadership of the Anglican world moves away from Britain and the Archbishop of Canterbury to Africa where the majority of Anglicans now are. There are those who are appalled by the moral relativism and smorgasbord approach to central Christian doctrines of some western Anglican Provinces and who wish to contend for the soul of the Anglican Communion. Justin Welby will be watching the gathering anxiously and wondering what impact it will have on the planned 2020 Lambeth Conference. Already the Ugandan bench of bishops has announced that it won't be attending and Nigeria is likely to follow suit.
