Brass band concert items The programme for the St Kilda brass band concert here at St Peters on Saturday 8 September is taking shape. Items so far agreed are *Fanfare for the Common Man* by Aaron Copeland, *Clair de Lune* by Debussy, *James Bond Collection* arranged by Jerry Goldsmith, *Concerto de Aranjuez* by Rodrigo, *Liberty Bell March* by Sousa, *Nimrod and Finale* by Elgar, *Trumpet Concerto* by Henry James, *Stranger on the Shore.* We might say a prayer for Director Shane Foster and the band as they prepare for the national championships at the end of this month at which they compete to keep their pre-eminent position amongst New Zealand's brass bands. Can you take a poster advertising the concert from the altar at the back and find a public noticeboard or shop front window willing to exhibit it?

Parish telephone list There have been several parishioner requests for a parish telephone list made available only to regular St Peter's parishioners. This has now been compiled and is available for collection this morning.

<u>Wardens' meeting</u> The Vicar will meet with the Wardens on Wednesday. Please let the Wardens know of any matters you want raised at that meeting.

Applying in hope The Vestry has decided to obtain an engineering report on the church and a geotechnical report on the land surrounding the church at a cost of \$24,000. This week the Vicar filed an application with the DCC heritage fund to finance this. The fund makes quarterly distributions of \$130,000 with the close off date for the next distribution at the end of July and a decision expected in early August.

<u>Christchurch Episcopal election</u> Nominations for the electoral Synod of the diocese of Christchurch have now closed. So far as is known there are at least three candidates – an evangelical, a centrist formerly of evangelical lineage and a moderate liberal. The election will take place in August with emeritus Archbishop David Moxon presiding.

Exeunt the conservative evangelicals Four parishes have now opted to leave the Christchurch diocese and have met with the Archbishop and the Archdeacons to put in place the arrangements for a gracious and dignified exit. They are St Johns Latimer Square, St Stephens Shirley, Christchurch South (this incorporates St Saviours Sydenham and St Nicholas Barrington St) and St Johns Woolston. Other departures may be on the cards. Although the Vicar of Sumner parish intends to stay many of his parishioners may depart. Avonhead parish is also of interest since its Vicar has expressed much disquiet about the authorising of same sex blessings although most of his parishioners will stay. Why has Christchurch diocese been at the epicentre of the grand exodus? In part this is because some of its younger clergy were trained at Moore College, Sydney, which mirrors the conservative opinions of the Jenson brothers who have dominated that diocese in recent years. It is also a reflection of the fact that often the growth experienced by conservative evangelical parishes has been transfer growth of Christians from other conservative denominations such as the Pentecostals and the Baptists who were never enculturated into an Anglican sense of ecclesiology and who are used to transferring denominations several times in a lifetime when a church does things they disagree with. At the same time the liberal revisionist leaders of our national church cannot be surprised at this vigorous blowback from their controversial stance on what is or isn't a rightly ordered relationship. The practical problem left behind by these departures is the need to redistribute the load of financing the central diocesan support structures amongst the remaining parishes. Conservative evangelicals tend to be generous givers and their parishes paid a major chunk of the diocesan running costs.
