A Reflection on Mark's Gospel

Rowan Williams comments that St Mark was probably St Peter's secretary and travelled with him recording his words and interpreting them for his audience. It is possible he travelled with St Paul.

He is writing for a church "baffled and fearful because, instead of signs and miracles, there is persecution and a sense of threat and failure" (p46). So he writes to reinforce a faith in a God who does not "step down from Heaven to solve problems but who is already in the heart of the world..."

Relatively little attention was paid to Mark's gospel in the early medieval Church, but two great theologians, Jurgan Moltmann and Anthony Bloom (see last week's Pebble) say they owe their Christian faith simply to reading Mark.
