Avonside thefts When Holy Trinity Avonside Christchurch was destroyed in a set of cumulative earthquakes some sanctuary items were removed to safe storage. The Church Property Trustees however charged the parish for the storage. Thinking a rebuild imminent the parish set up a storage shed on site and relocated these items to it. Thieves broke in to the shed last week and removed most of the items. Uncertainty hangs over the Avonside parish given the recent decision to run down the Anglican aged care facility in the parish's immediate vicinity.

Major schism threatens in the Eastern Orthodox world The leader of the Eastern Orthodox world is Bartholomew, the Ecumenical Patriarch of Constantinople, modern day Istanbul. The largest church in the Eastern Orthodox world is the Russian Orthodox Church with around 150 million followers. It is newly invigorated since it was set free from communist persecution. Its leader Patriarch Kirill is attentive to the interests of the Russian Federation just as his predecessors were to the Tsarist state. Ukraine's breakaway from Russia has created considerable tensions in its religious world. Around 12,000 parishes, a third of the Moscow Patriarchate's parishes, lie within Ukraine. This was the only officially recognised or tolerated church in the Stalinist era. But Ukraine has two other Orthodox churches, that of the Kiev Patriarchate with around 4,800 parishes, and that of the Ukrainian Autocephalous Orthodox Church with 1,000 parishes. They have applied to Patriarch Bartholomew for autocephaly or self-governing status and he has granted this. The two Ukrainian Orthodox churches will now come together into one denomination, a move welcomed by the Ukrainian government which has criticised the Moscow Patriarchate for meddling in their internal affairs on behalf of the Putin government. Patriarch Kirill has retaliated by breaking off relations with the Ecumenical Patriarch and may seek to draw other Orthodox churches to recognise it as the true centre of Orthodoxy. This is of a piece with a recent development in which a pan orthodox conciliar Synod was called together on the Island of Cyprus after years of planning by the Ecumenical Patriarch in an attempt to heal the divisions in the Orthodox world in a kind of Orthodox Vatican 2, and was boycotted by Russia and its allies.
