This year's lectures are as follows:

13 November: The faith of a ballet dancer The Revd Toby Behan danced with the Royal New Zealand Ballet Company from 1993 to 2003. During his time with the company Toby danced a variety of roles including Peter (Peter Pan), Jonathan Harker (Dracula), and Quasimodo (The Hunchback of Notre Dame). He has been a choreographer with RNZB and currently serves on its board. Ordained Deacon in February this year he is currently a School Chaplain. In this first of the Caversham Lectures Toby will outline his own journey of faith and will use his experience and observations from a career in the arts to offer some reflections on the importance of continuing Christian Influence on art, culture and society, and the benefits of creativity in our lives as Christians.

20 November: Teaching an old brain new tricks Professor John Reynolds, Department of Anatomy, Otago medical School, describes how best to protect our brain function as we age, how we might protect ourselves from common brain disorders and new methods to treat these disorders when they occur.

27 November: The faith of a bishop Bishop Steven Benford gives some personal background to his journey into an ardent Christian faith and his dual vocations as a doctor, a priest and a bishop.

4 December: The ID international emerging designers award Marot Barton returns to give us the background to this year's highly successful emerging designers award, which she organised.
