Reflections on Revelation 1: 4-8 todays second lesson

John's greeting to the 7 churches in Asia concludes with a vision of Christ returning in judgement: "Look he is coming with the clouds.." This is consistent with Revelation as a whole: A vision of what will be, what is coming. Notably absent is an analysis of the current situation, projections, financial forecasts and strategic plans. This is a language that evokes rather than describes, picture language. It is good to be reminded of this when we, who are faced with a myriad of institutional problems, seek institutional answers. What will the church look like in 10 or 15 years? What will ministry look like? How do we reposition ourselves? Those might be the pressing questions, but they are not the important questions from a biblical perspective.

The future orientation of church and ministry is inextricably linked to the future orientation of the Kingdom, a future that has come among us in Jesus Christ, but the fullness of which still awaits us. Think of the beatitudes, the logic of Jesus' parables, and the absurdity of the resurrection. These are counter intuitive, counter to prevailing wisdom and all available evidence but compelling. This is because the prevailing ways of thinking and acting in our world not only perpetuate violence, oppression and injustice; they have brought our world to the brink of the abyss. And the human spirit, far from reaching a state of enlightenment, is revealed to be impoverished and fragile, held captive to false ideologies and world-views.

He had been thanked for his "powerful message." The St Kilda brass band concert at St Peter's was reckoned to have been a considerable success and it was thought that they should be invited back next year.
