Unusual episcopal installation The next Bishop of Christchurch the Revd Peter Carrell comes in to office in February next year. This requires a two part process, his ordination at the hands of brother bishops and then his installation in his cathedra, his chair of office and authority in his Cathedral. He has chosen to be ordained in the Christchurch Boys High School auditorium as did the Catholic Bishop because this has a large seating capacity. However, his installation will be an outdoor affair in the Square outside the ruined Cathedral. Apart from the theological and liturgical oddity of not being installed in his Cathedral, which is the transitional Cathedral, this choice presents considerable practical problems as anyone familiar with Canterbury weather patterns knows that February is the season of Nor' West winds. Season of dance films The promised season of dance films begins in January on successive Saturday afternoons in the Vicarage at 2 pm beginning with Mao's Last Dancer on 12 January about Li Cunxin's remarkable journey from Mao's cultural revolution to becoming an acclaimed dancer in the west. Then on 19 January Balanchine about George Balanchine, trained at Russia's Maryinsky theatre, who became the "father of American ballet." Then on 26 January Suzanne Farrell: Elusive Muse, a candid account of her complex relationship with Balanchine.
