The current theological enthusiasms of St John's College Auckland students The Revd Toby Behan who kicked of this year's Caversham lectures is a recent graduate of our national theological college St John's Auckland. During his time with us I asked him privately about the kinds of theology that his contemporaries at St John's were interested in and were pursuing with enthusiasm. He immediately replied "Liberation theology and Feminist theology." For those who don't know liberation theology was born in the favelas of Latin America as a way of pursuing Christian existence in the face of corrupt and dictatorial regimes. It puts the book of Exodus end on end with Marxist analysis. All Anglican ordinands ought to know what Feminist and Liberation theology is but a priest who makes it their primary theological resourcing point will find it thin gruel and somewhat irrelevant for parish ministry in say Ashburton, Gore or Blenheim. This is not the first time that St John's Auckland has left its graduates ill equipped for a lifetime's ministry in rural, provincial and urban New Zealand. The generation raised on nuclear free pacific theology had all exited ministry within a few years of leaving its hallowed halls. However, all is not doom and gloom in the teaching of theology at St John's as the Otago theology department is now its main provider and the Revd Chris Holmes gently but firmly insists that the students direct their attention to the greats of the Church's systematic theology tradition such as Augustine, Aquinas, Barth, Von Balthasar and Torrance. Here true and life giving wisdom can be found to fund a lifetime of faithful preaching and pastoral ministry.
