January at St Peter's Evensong and Benediction with a follow on social gathering in the lounge will continue as usual on the first Sunday of the month 6 January with the Epiphany Carol Service taking place that morning at 10.30 am. The Thursday Eucharists will also continue uninterrupted. In addition to the season of dance films there will be a parish BBQ preceded by an early evening Mass at a date to be announced.

<u>The reports</u> Geosolve has presented its report on the geotechnical aspects of the soils on which the church stands. This is a highly technical document intended mainly to resource the engineering report that is expected to be completed by February. A major focus of the Geosolve report is what could be done to level up the church floor and to make it quake resistant.

Developments at St Matthews Dunedin The Revd Stuart Crosson and the majority of lay people at St Matthews are in the process of disaffiliating from the diocese of Dunedin and the Anglican Church of Aotearoa New Zealand and Polynesia. Now renamed "Hope Church" they will be worshipping from now on at the Church of Christ church on the corner of St Andrew St and Filleul St. Their Sunday Service starts at 9 am but they must conclude by 10.15 am to make way for the Church of Christ congregation, something of a limitation given their love of lengthy sermons and ecstasy rituals. Presumably they will in due course affiliate to the Extra Provincial diocese, currently in the process of formation, that is expected to ordain its missionary bishop in New Zealand sometime in 2019. Meanwhile back at the ranch the rump core of remaining St Matthew's parishioners are organising a new Vestry and Wardens. They will be looked after for now by the Revd Peter Ross, until recently assistant priest at Balclutha. Peter was relatively recently ordained, a late vocation, having previously been an engineer and a Pentecostal Pastor. A question hanging over the emergent rump core remaining parish is whether the 40 or so congregants will be able to afford a full time Vicar, pay St Matthew's share of the diocesan quota and keep up with the maintenance costs of a large historic church. This could be quite a struggle.
