January at St Peter's Evensong and Benediction with a follow on social gathering in the lounge will continue as usual next Sunday. The Thursday Eucharists will also continue uninterrupted. Director of Anglican Centre in Rome steps down after sexual misconduct allegations Parishioners may recall that New Zealand Archbishop David Moxon retired from the above position in 2017. Last week the governors of the Anglican Centre in Rome announced the resignation of David's successor, Archbishop Bernard Ntahouri, following an allegation of sexual misconduct. Its director is also the Archbishop of Canterbury's Personal representative to the Holy See. Archbishop Bernard was installed as Director in October 2017. He was previously the Primate of the Anglican Church of Burundi. Before ordination he was a civil servant who served as chief of staff to Burundi's President Jean-Baptiste Bagaza. He served four years in prison following the 1987 military coup. Later he was appointed Bishop of Matana and then Archbishop of Burundi. He also worked as vice-chair of the country's commission on truth and reconciliation. Parishioners may recall that Burundi experienced a genocide in 1993 when Hutus set about a mass killing of Tutsis. This development will come as a personal blow to Archbishop Justin Welby who had seen this appointment of someone so close to the African GAFCON bishops as a helpful step in attempting to woo the GAFCON bishops to attend the 2020 Lambeth Conference. Already Nigeria, Uganda and Rwanda have announced they will be boycotting the event.
