The inviting or not of episcopal spouses to the Lambeth Conference Archbishop Justin Welby is labouring mightily to make a success of next year's Lambeth Conference in the hope of reducing as much as possible the number of African Provinces boycotting the event. A recent problem has emerged because episcopal spouses are invited as well with welcoming events planned for them as part of the conference. Those Provinces that have opted for gay marriage have begun to incorporate bishops in their episcopal bench who are same sex partnered, most notably Kevin Robertson, an assistant bishop of Toronto, who recently married his boyfriend in a church Service presided over by the bishop of New Westminster and the newly elected bishop of Maine who has been married for some time. Also worthy of mention are Mary Glasspool, an assistant bishop of New York, who is married to her lesbian partner and Nicholas Chamberlain, bishop of Grantham, one of the suffragans of the diocese of Lincoln, who is in a civil union with his partner, gay marriage not being an option in the Church of England. In the hope of keeping the African provinces on board Justin Welby has made it clear that while these bishops are welcome their spouses are not invited. Meanwhile closer to home the Christchurch Press has embarrassed the newly ordained bishop of Christchurch Peter Carrell by pointing out his attendance at the first same sex blessing to take place in the diocese. The Press did not state whom this involved or where it took place but it is likely to have been the union of Jeremy Johnson, the Diocesan Chancellor, with his male partner in the Christ's College Chapel, a shrewd choice of location given that Jeremy is president of the old boy's association and a member of the Tuis, a newly formed support group for gay, bi-sexual and transgender old boys.
