The preliminary engineers report on St Peters Sean O'Neill of Hanlons gave his preliminary engineering and geo-technical report on St Peter's Church to the Wednesday Vestry meeting. The main take away was that the roof is where earthquake strengthening measures need to start. A diaphragm needs to be inserted in the roof to give it greater strength and to make it water tight. Some water infiltration has occurred. The roof would need to be fixed or tied to the brick walls. A new roof surface will be needed to replace the slates. The crosses need to come down from the roof. This would increase the earthquake strength factor of the church building to 65%, i.e. this is the percentage compared to a modern building built to 100% specifications. The west wall is leaning in but it should be left alone. A steel ring beam should be inserted at the top of the tower to prevent the parapet falling on to Hillside Rd. The floor should be re-piled with the damaged framing being replaced or repaired and a damp proof membrane installed underneath the floor. The difficulty here is that some of the floor is in good shape having been given some attention relatively recently while other parts in in a sorry state. Rising damp and rising and falling water levels are a major underfloor problem. The gable end wall of the sanctuary needs to be re-clad and the damaged framing replaced as required
