What is really going on at St Matthew's Since the split and departure of the Vicar of St Matthews and a portion of his congregation there have been conflicting reports as to how many have gone and how many have stayed. At a meeting at the diocesan headquarters in January of Vicars and Wardens to report on the state of the Dunedin parishes the newly appointed Bishop's Warden of St Matthew's said it had been a 50/50 split but that didn't seem right when the leave vote had been 79 to 20. Since then eye witness accounts have given a more accurate picture of the state of play. The Revd Stu Crosson and his Hope Church have around 90 at their 9 am Sunday Service. They are predominately students not a few of whom are relatively unaware of the reason for the split. They are there because they like Stu and because their friends and peer group are there. Students of course are a transitory group who move away when they have finished their degrees. The issue will be can they be replenished? Perhaps the Tertiary Student Christian Fellowship activists who are part of the Hope Church leadership team can accomplish this. The rump core back at St Matthew's number around the mid-40s on Sunday morning and are by and large at the older end of the spectrum. The Revd Peter Ross comes from Balclutha once a fortnight to celebrate the Eucharist while the St Matthew's lay leadership lead the Service and preach on the non-Eucharistic Sunday. The issue here is whether the diminished remnant can eventually afford a full time Vicar to build up the congregation again. The diocesan leadership is putting a brave face on what has happened but the reality is that the largest Anglican parish in Dunedin and possibly the diocese has been decimated.
